

n our second season of THE COMPLETE BACH, we focus on how Bach's music is performed today. The "period instrument" forces and the "modern instrument" players have tussled over Bach's legacy for half a century, we are now in a moment where both approaches have legitimacy. So we are presenting performances by both types of performers throughout the season.

This season, from Simone Dinnerstein to The Sebastians or from the BACHtoberfest Choir to Cantatathon, offers the Greater Worcester community presentation after presentation of Bach's music. It is an "embarrassment of Bach riches" as THE COMPLETE BACH checks off many more of the master's work in Year 2 of this monumental project.

Bach101

The 2025–2026 season marks the start of Year 2 of THE COMPLETE BACH: by Spring 2035, Worcester will become home to each known work composed by J.S. Bach. Artistic Director Chris Shepard, the driver behind the project, feels the composer's vast library of work is anything but daunting ... rather, it's a thrill.

Programming 11 years in advance is an exciting challenge in terms of distribution of music, rehearsal and performance, and re-imagining how Bach is heard in the 21st century. The goal of this 132-concert series is to invite listeners of all backgrounds to expand their knowledge of Bach, and to experience his music in new ways, by bringing Bach's repertoire to the stage alongside dance, film, and other genres of music. Music Worcester is very likely the first presenter of an entirely live-performance project like this since Bach's lifetime. Our programming of THE COMPLETE BACH reflects how Bach heard his own music performed—by everyone. From professional court ensembles and orchestras to amateur choirs, annual regroupings like the BACHtoberfest choir, and a growing roster of performers in the Worcester Bach Collective, Music Worcester aims to activate all kinds of performers and listeners.



EDUCATION & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

usic Worcester's commitment to engaging with our community goes beyond bringing world-class talent to the area's concert halls. We also engage learners of all ages with opportunities like masterclasses, coachings, demonstrations, Q&As, and more. Last season, Music Worcester brought six ensembles into schools to work directly with students throughout the region in classrooms and rehearsal rooms: Zlatomir Fung, Rodney Marsalis Big Brass, Imani Winds, Boston Brass, Sphinx Virtuosi, and Time For Three. This season, Music Worcester continues to activate education spaces throughout the Worcester area through our direct work with elementary, middle, and high schools.

Because learning never stops, Music Worcester strives to provide enriching opportunities to audiences of all ages. In addition to our three THE COMPLETE BACH podcast series (read more on page 11), Music Worcester's education and outreach activities include the following programs.

The Worcester Chorus Award for Musical Excellence was established by The Worcester Chorus in 2010 and previously known as the Dr. Gerald R. Mack Music Award. Each year, a graduating senior from a Worcester-area school who is majoring in music is granted the award to help them further their music education. This award honors Dr. Mack's lifelong dedication to music education, as well as the next generation of musicians and educators. In the 2024–25 academic year, soprano Margaret King was the recipient of the award and will continue her studies at Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. Applications for the 2026 award will open in the spring.



HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW MUSIC WORCESTER'S HISTORY?

Whith more than 150 years of providing exceptional musical experiences for Central Massachusetts audiences, Music Worcester embarks on an archival project to digitize our history, with seed funding from The Fletcher Foundation. This project will organize, preserve, and document materials including programs and posters, sheet music, broadcast transcripts and articles, some dating back to the Worcester Music Festival's inception. It will also include hundreds of high-quality concert recordings beginning with the organization's return to Mechanics Hall following its renovation in the late 1970s. In addition to preserving our history, Music Worcester aims to make this information accessible to the public in the near future.

Answer: D. In 1977, the first concert after the Mechanics Hall renovations was an all-Beethoven program featuring his *Consecration of the House*, *Piano Concerto No. 5*, and *Symphony No. 5*. David Epstein conducted The Worcester Orchestra, and Andre-Michel Schub was the piano soloist. This season, Alexandre Kantorow will perform Beethoven's *Piano Sonata No. 32* on April 17, 2026.
